The Steamboat Rock City Council met in regular session March 11, 2019, 6:34 p.m. at City Hall. Present were Mayor Marvin Veld and the following Councilmembers: Eric Nielsen, Carol Williams, Kevin Pieters, Cory Schurman. Not present: Adam Blackburn. Also present were Craig Babcock, Ryan Stupp, JD Holmes, Melissa Johanson, Vicki Hutchcroft, Heidi Mitchell, Todd Fleming, Scott Williams and JJ Veld. Mayor Marvin Veld called the meeting to order. Cory Schurman moved and Eric Nielsen seconded approval of the agenda as posted. Carried. Carol Williams moved and Eric Nielsen seconded that minutes from the February meeting be approved. Carried. Cory Schurman moved and Eric Nielsen seconded the City bills be paid. Carried. Cory Schurman moved and Eric Nielsen seconded the Community Center bills be paid by the Schoolhouse Committee as funds are available. Carried. At 6:45 p.m. a public hearing was held to approve the 2019/20 budget. There were no written or oral objections to the proposed budget. Carol Williams moved and Cory Schurman seconded the 2019/20 budget be approved as submitted. Carol Williams advised City Clerk to get to the Courthouse by March 15th. Carried. Heidi Mitchell was present requesting permission to close Market Street for Bike Days on the following dates: May 18, June 15, July 20, August 17, and September 21 from 5p.m. to 9p.m. Council has allowed Heidi to start blocking off the street at a time she feels necessary to get things set up for the bike nights from 5p.m. – 9p.m. She also asked to have the same street closed for the Lindsay Stupp 2nd Annual Memorial Ride & street dance on Saturday, May 11th, 7p.m.– 11p.m. Cory Schurman moved and Eric Nielsen seconded the street be closed on the above mentioned dates. Carried. Mayor presented that Jeff Risius

will need to have his placed cleaned up but with the weather it is understandable that the changes have not been made. At the next meeting in April the Council will make a movement on it and have it taken care of. Diane Heninger was not present for meeting but the Council did decide that they will not put up signs requested at this time. Library report given by Melissa Johanson: The Library received a \$2500.00 grant. The Library received over forty leather bound books from Janice Kramer's family. It is much appreciated from the library and the City from the family. The Library is in the process of starting a "Friends of the Library" and any money that goes to that the library will keep as their donations. Fire Department report given by Ryan Stupp: They would like to upgrade the lighting to LED's and there is a wonderful rebate right now to receive by March 28th. Motion was made by Eric Nielsen to go ahead and get them and it was seconded by Cory Schurman. Carried. Public Works report given by JJ Veld: The sewer pump went down and the estimated cost is \$4,358.00 to be repaired. The water main break by the Well is currently being repaired. The second reading of Ordinance #19-2 re: water rates was read. Motion was made to waive the 3rd reading and it was passed and approved, moved by, Cory Schurman, seconded by Eric Nielsen and carried by roll call vote, Eric Nielsen- yes, Cory Schurman- yes, Carol Williams- no, Kevin Pieters- no, due to a tie vote Mayor Veld held a vote of yes. Motion carried. The third reading of Ordinance #18-4 re: sewer rates was read. It was passed and approved, moved by, Cory Schurman seconded by Eric Nielsen and carried by roll call vote, Eric Nielsen- yes, Cory Schurman- yes, Carol Williams- no, Kevin Pieters- yes. Motion carried. The City of Steamboat Rock's City wide clean-up day and household hazardous waste is set for the same day on June 8th from 9 a.m to 11 a.m. Being no further business, Carol
