2. ŘEAP Grant Presentation – a \$75,000 check was presented for the lowa River's Edge Trail from a grant that the city applied through the state of lowa. Motion by Kramer, seconded by Drake to give the \$75,000 check. Motion carried unanimously.

3. Review Preliminary Financials – Cindy, a consultant for the city, discussed the work she has been doing with Joyce to amend the budget and working on end of month totals. She stated that they have done a "soft" closing without affecting July and the numbers have not been presented to department heads yet. She explained that the city is staying close to budget, and they are waiting on the audit for the

2022 Fiscal Year.

4. Resolution 07-23-3261; Resolution Approving the Monthly Claims. Motion by Morton, seconded by Drake to approve the monthly claims. Ayes: Drake, Morton, Kramer, Priske, and May Jr. Nays: Kramer. Motion passed.

Kelly Haskin, Public Works Director explained that raising the cost of electricity and money need to be set aside for future projects to repair and improve systems. Drake asked if we are saving money by sending it out to the third-party lab. Haskin explained that it requires labor costs and certifications to continue to have it done in the city. Motion by May Jr., seconded by Morton to approve the resolution. Motion carried unanimously.

Budweg mentioned that the personnel committee is continuing to work on the amended handbook for certifications and wage adjustments. Motion by Morton, seconded by Drake to approve the resolution.
