Call Meeting to Order

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Board President Jared Cook with the reading of the mission statement "Embracing today's challenges, preparing for tomorrow's world "

Discuss/Action Consent Agenda Motion by Nick LaVelle seconded by Marc Anderson to approve the consent agenda. All voted in favor. The motion carried. Includ-

ed in the consent agenda along with the agenda, February regular and joint meeting minutes, report of disbursements, and financial report were the following items: open enrollments for Ashden and Ava Smitherman from E-NP to Marshalltown; a staff resignation from Tracie Akers as high school counselor; a 2023-24 AEA Purchasing Agreement for Food, Small Wares, and Ware Wash; a University of Northern Iowa Cooperative Agreement; and a Morningside University Co-

operative Agreement. Public Report Time - None Discuss/Action Budget Guaran-

tee Resolution FY 2024 Dr. Zellmer noted this is something we do each year but this is a year we won't have to use it due to increased enrollment and 3% SSA. onded by Maggie VanderWilt to set the public hearing date for the 2023-24 Certified Budget for Monday. April 10, 2023 at 7 p.m. at the E-NP District Office Board Room. All voted in favor. The motion carried.

Discuss/Action 2023-24 School <u>Calendar</u>

Dr. Zellmer recommends approving the 2023-24 calendar with the caveat that we will come back at a later date to get the September PD added and homecoming week added once the football schedule comes out from the state for the next two years. The first day of school will be August 23, 2023 and the last day is currently set at May 22, 2024. Motion by Maggie VanderWilt seconded by Breanne Butler to approve the 2023-2024 School Calendar. All voted in favor. The motion carried.

Discuss/Action Board Resolution to Join Iowa Local Government Risk Pool

Dr. Zellmer noted we discussed this at the joint meeting last month and the premium we can lock in on this month is \$60,577.01 for fiscal year 2023-24. This premium can be paid from Management Fund which gives more flexibility in the general fund. Motion by Breanne Butler seconded by Jay Stanish to approve the resolution to join the Iowa Local Government Risk Pool for the 2023-24 School Year. Roll call vote: Aves: Cook, LaVelle, VanderWilt, Butler, Stanish, Herring, and Anderson. Nays: None. The motion carried.

Greg Pfantz presented the EN-PEA initial contract proposal for the 2023-24 school vear.

Discuss/Action Memo of Understanding with iJAG

Dr. Zellmer informed the board that the iJAG memorandum of understanding was sent to them today. It will include \$6,250 for the remainder of 2022-23 and \$25,000 per year for the next 3 years which we will use ESSER funds for. Motion by Marc Anderson seconded by Nick LaVelle to approve the Memorandum of Understanding with iJAG. All voted in favor. The motion carried. Discuss/Action ESSER 3 Plan

<u>Review</u>

Dr. Zellmer noted the \$81,250 approved for the iJAG program will be spent from ESSER 3 funds. We are still waiting on a price quote for the HVAC on the elementary project and we are also reviewing a math curriculum. Motion by Breanne Butler seconded by Maggie VanderWilt to approve the ESSER 3 Plan. All voted in favor. The motion carried.

Discuss/Action School Picture Vendor Selection for the 2023-24 School Year

Dr Zellmer noted we had 3 vendors submit bids to take school pictures for 2023-24. With the initial package requests, Images by Mosch is the low bidder. Motion by Emily Herring seconded by Breanne Butler to approve Images by Mosch as the E-NP School Picture Photographer for the 2023-24 School Year. All voted in favor. The motion carried.

Discuss School Communications Systems

Dr. Zellmer noted we had a presenter at the joint meeting talk to us about school communication systems and he is waiting on answers to some key components. The board would like Dr. Zellmer to continue to look into the communications system.

Discuss 2022-23 School Calendar & Makeup Days

With the adding of May 22nd and 23rd as makeup days we are able to stay at 8.5 hours above the 1080 required instructional hours. Dr. Zellmer recommends waiting and seeing what happens in March and early April with weather and only add additional time if needed.

Administrator/Supervisor/Superintendent Comments

Mr. Henrichs informed the board

of the elementary's 3rd quarter assembly Friday, kindergarten and preschool roundups, a 5th grade April 5th trip to the capitol, ISASP testing and conferences. Mr. Rundall noted scheduling was starting, a good musical last weekend, MAP testing starts tomorrow, track is starting, and state speech is going on.

Mrs. Walker informed the board at the February professional development day the middle school completed SAMI, April 10th the elementary will complete SAMI, and we are due for an ISASP audit.

Dr. Zellmer noted approximately 40 staff and others will be involved in the elementary principal interviews tomorrow. He highlighted legislation: HF41relating to transportation to and from school of pupils participating in open enrollment, HF99 relating to approve courses of instruction for school bus drivers. HF 100 relating to minimum age of applicants for licenses from the board of educational examiners. and HF 123 relating to operational sharing.
